Myers Brown is a native of Old Hickory, Tennessee. He received his B.A. in history from Oglethorpe University and his M.A. in public history from Middle Tennessee State University. He is a fellow and a current officer of the Company of Military Historians and is on the board of the Tennessee Civil War National Heritage Area and the Tennessee Civil War Preservation Association.

Currently, Myers serves as the Executive Director of Belmont Mansion in Nashville. Prior to joining Belmont, he served as Director of Archival Collection Services and Chief Historian at the Tennessee State Library and Archives. He previously worked as a curator with the Tennessee State Museum, the Alabama Historical Commission, and at the Atlanta History Center. He also served as the chairman of the Tennessee War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission.

He is the author of two books: *Images of Tennessee's Union Cavalrymen* (published in December 2008) and *Images of Tennessee Confederates* (April 2011). He served as editor of the *Best of the Tennessee Historical Quarterly, Volume 5, Nathan Bedford Forrest and the Confederate Cavalry in West Tennessee* (published April 2013).

He has or currently is an adjunct professor at Trevecca Nazarene University, Lipscomb University, Cumberland University, and Volunteer State Community College.
