Hugh Wilson Esq of the City of New Orleans, who declared,  
that he last holder and owner he had received payment in  
full of Eighteen certain promissory notes, drawn by Mrs  
Felicia Stays Acklin to his own order and by her endorsed,  
and also endorsed by her husband Joseph A. Acklin, all  
and payable as follows, viz: Ten for the sum of Five Thousand Dollars each,  
dated March 15-1861, ~~and~~ payable respectively on the 1<sup>st</sup> of  
October 1861 - 15<sup>th</sup> of October 1861 - 1<sup>st</sup> of November 1861 -  
15<sup>th</sup> of November 1861 - 1<sup>st</sup> of December 1861 - 15<sup>th</sup> of December  
1861 - 1<sup>st</sup> of January 1862 - 15<sup>th</sup> of January 1862 - 1<sup>st</sup> of  
February 1862 - and 15<sup>th</sup> February 1862. - Six for the sum  
of Three Thousand Dollars each, payable respectively on the  
First and Fifteenth days of March 1862. - Four for the sum of  
Two Thousand Dollars each, payable respectively on the First  
of April 1862 - 15<sup>th</sup> of April 1862 - 1<sup>st</sup> of May 1862 - and 15<sup>th</sup> of  
May 1862. - and Six for the sum of Five Thousand Dollars  
each, payable respectively on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> days of June  
1862, all bearing interest, after maturity, if not then paid  
at the rate of Eight per cent per annum until final pay-  
ment, and secured in their payment by the Mortgage granted  
by said Mrs A. H. Acklin through her attorney S. C. Nelson in  
favor of Pravly Wilson & Co of this City, or any other holders of  
said notes, by an act passed before Theodore C. Abbott, late a  
Notary in this City, on the 10<sup>th</sup> of April 1861, on the following  
described landed property, to-wit: 1<sup>st</sup> - A certain tract of land situated, lying and  
being in the Parish of West Feliciana in this State, on the left  
bank of the Mississippi River, cultivated in Cotton under the  
names respectively of Angola, Longo and Lechmond plan-  
tations, and composed of fractional sections designated respectively,

by the numbers Fifteen, Twenty two, Twenty three, Twenty seven,  
 Forty five, Forty six, Forty seven, Forty eight, Forty nine, Fifty,  
 Fifty seven, Fifty eight, Fifty nine, Sixty, Sixty one, Sixty two and Sixty  
 three, of Township one, Range five west, in the District of lands sub-  
 ject to sale at Brunswick, Louisiana, according to the survey  
 of the late United States Government, the said lands containing in  
 the aggregate Five Thousand, Four Hundred and one 7/100 acres —  
 also all the stock of farming utensils and implements, Mules, Horses,  
 Cattle &c on said plantations
