Barrow and Henry Perkins, male residents of said Parish of West Feliciana, over the age of twenty-one years, Experts and Appraisers, to value and appraise the property belonging to said succession, who are present and take and subscribe the following oath, justly and impartially, to discharge and perform all, and singular, their duties devolving on them in their said capacity of Experts and Appraisers of said succession, to wit:
